

Investigation into the conditions and circumstances resulting in the tragic death of Dag Hammarskjöld and of the members of the party accompanying him

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolutions 1759 (XVII) of 26 October 1962, 69/246 of 29 December 2014, and 70/11 of 19 November 2015,

Underlining the shared responsibility to pursue the full truth concerning the conditions and circumstances resulting in the tragic death of Dag Hammarskjöld and of the members of the party accompanying him,

Recognizing that a further inquiry or investigation would be necessary to finally establish the facts of the matter,

Expressing appreciation for the continued commitment of the Secretary-General to the search for the truth in this regard,

Acknowledging the note of the Secretary-General of 17 August 2016 and his assessment of the way forward,¹

1. *Requests* the Secretary-General to appoint an eminent person to review the potential new information, including that which may be available from Member States, to assess its probative value, and to determine the scope that any further inquiry or investigation should take, and, if possible, to draw conclusions from the investigations already conducted;

2. *Urges* all Member States to release any relevant records in their possession and to provide to the Secretary-General relevant information related to the death of Dag Hammarskjöld and of the members of the party accompanying him;

3. *Encourages* Member States to ensure that any relevant records related to the death of Dag Hammarskjöld and of the members of the party accompanying him that remain classified, more than fifty years after the fact, are declassified or otherwise made available for review;

4. *Requests* the Secretary-General to continue to explore the feasibility of the establishment of a central archival holding or other holistic arrangement for records and archives related to the death of Dag Hammarskjöld and of the members of the party accompanying him, and to provide to the General Assembly concrete and actionable recommendations thereon;

5. *Requests* the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly before the end of its seventy-first session of any further progress made;

6. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its seventy-second session the item entitled "Investigation into the conditions and circumstances resulting in the tragic death of Dag Hammarskjöld and of the members of the party accompanying him".
